- AdVenturing Crew: The Venturing program is unique because it uses extreme outdoor adventure
  as the method for building character, peer-to-peer bonds, and independence. It's open to young
  men and women between the ages of 14 and 20.
- Volunteer Quest: Scouting volunteers come from a variety of backgrounds and experiences, but all are committed to one thing — leading youth to become responsible, caring, and competent citizens.
